RESOLUTION NO. 2015-022

APPROVING THE MINIMUM STANDARD  
IN THE SPECIFICATIONS FOR HEAVY MOTORCYCLE 645CC

WHEREAS, Section 14, paragraphs (i) and (m) of Republic Act No. 6975, as amended by Section 5, paragraph (a), sub-paragraphs (5) and (8) of the Republic Act No. 8551, empowers the Commission to “approve or modify plans and programs on education and training, logistical requirements, communications, records, information system, crime laboratory, crime prevention and crime reporting as well as prescribe minimum standards for arms, equipment and uniforms and, after consultation with the Philippine Heraldry Commission, for insignia of ranks, awards and medals of honor”;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the aforesaid legal prescription, the PNP, through Uniform and Equipment Standardization Board (UESB) Resolution No. 2014-007 dated February 6, 2014, has submitted and favorably indorsed the proposed minimum standard in the specifications for Motorcycle 645cc for consideration and approval by the Commission;

WHEREAS, the PNP-UESB proposed minimum standard specifications is for the used by the Highway Patrol Group (HPG), to augment the existing mobility assets to effectively perform its mandated mission and functions;

WHEREAS, the PNP Uniform and Equipment Standardization Board (UESB) has certified that the proposed minimum standards in the specifications for Motorcycle 645cc is not tailored fit to a particular brand in the market;

WHEREAS, after thorough review and evaluation, the Commission has determined the UESB proposed minimum standard in the specifications for Heavy Motorcycle 645cc complies to the requirement of Republic Act No. 6975 as amended by Republic Act No. 8551, its implementing rules and regulations (IRR), and all existing rules and regulations to meet the requirements of the PNP;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Commission, in the exercise of its statutory powers to administer and control the PNP, **HAS RESOLVED, AS IT HEREBY RESOLVES**, to approve the minimum standard in the specifications for Heavy Motorcycle 645cc, to read as follows:

- a. Engine:
  - Fuel : Gasoline
  - Displacement : 645cc
  - Horsepower : 50
  - Torque : 5.2 kg-m
- b. Number of stroke : 4 stroke
- c. Number of cylinder : 1 cylinder
- d. Starting : Electric
- e. Transmission : 5 speed
- f. Suspension : Manufacturer's Standard
- g. Tires : Manufacturer's Standard
- h. Drive : Manufacturer's Standard
- i. Wheel : Manufacturer's Standard

- j. Brake system
  - Front : Disc
  - Rear : Manufacturer's Standard
- k. Fuel tank capacity : 14 liters
- l. Instrumentation/Gauges : Manufacturer's Standard
- m. Safety Lightings : Park light, tail light and plate light
- n. Accessories:
  - n.1. OVM tools;
  - n.2. Two (2) side mounted rear view mirrors;
  - n.3. Stainless steel crash guards;
  - n.4. Sided saddle bags with stainless steel support/crash guards with lock on the rear par;
  - n.5 Police siren with 4 programs and 100W speaker PA system;
  - n.6. Two (2) police blinkers as specified in the latest approved NAPOLCOM Resolution mounted on the front stainless steel crash guard; and
  - n.7. One (1) police blinker mounted on the rear with an adjustable height stainless steel pole color blue.
- o. Color and Markings . : white with appropriate markings specified in the latest approved NAPOLCOM Resolution for color and Markings
- p. Requirements : Maintenance/operational manual
- q. Must pass the approved Test Parameters by the Chief, PNP duly publicized and/or included in the Terms of Reference of the Bidding Documents.


