RESOLUTION No. - 2019-1024

**APPROVING THE RESTRUCTURING AND STRENGTHENING OF
15 POLICE STATIONS UNDER THE NATIONAL CAPITAL
REGION POLICE OFFICE (NCRPO)**

WHEREAS, the Constitution and Republic Act No. 6975, as amended by Republic Act No. 8551, placed the Philippine National Police (PNP) under the administrative control and operational supervision of the National Police Commission (NAPOLCOM);

WHEREAS, the PNP submitted for approval of the Commission a copy of NHQ-PNP General Orders Number DPL-18-16 which provides for the restructuring and strengthening of 15 Police Stations under the National Capital Region Police Office (NCRPO);

WHEREAS, the said PNP proposal includes, among others, the following salient provisions:

- a. Prescribing the standard structure for the Sub-Stations of 15 National Capital Region (NCR) Police Stations with a total complement of 71 uniformed personnel (9 Police Commissioned Officers (PCOs) and 62 Police Non-Commissioned Officers (PNCOs) per Sub-Station);
- b. Creation of two 11-Man SWAT Teams under Patrol Operations Sections;
- c. Additional 16 Sub-Stations of six NCR Police Stations, broken down as follows: 3 in Malabon City Police Station (CPS) and 2 in Valenzuela CPS under Northern Police District (NPD); 4 in Marikina under Eastern Police District (EPD); and 1 in Las Piñas CPS, 2 in Muntinlupa CPS and 4 in Taguig CPS under Southern Police District (SPD);
- d. Increasing the personnel complement (UP and NUP) of 15 NCR Stations under NPD, EDP and SPD from 9,872 to 12,293 positions, broken down as follows: 15 third level PCO positions, 1,356 second level PCO positions, 10,648 second level/PNCO positions, and 274 NUP positions. Four Hundred Fifty (450) additional positions for NUP will be subject to the approval and release of funds by the Department of Budget and Management;
- e. Rationalization of the distribution of identified 12,293 uniformed personnel for 15 Police Stations in NPD, EPD and SPD as follows:

SPD Police Stations</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pasay CPS • Makati CPS • Parañaque CPS • Las Piñas CPS • Muntinlupa CPS • Taguig CPS • Pateros MPS 	<p>The strengthening of SPD Police Stations will require additional 1,258 uniformed personnel distributed as follows:</p> <p>83 Additional PCOs and 202 PNCOs for Pasay CPS 76 Additional PCOs and 50 PNCOs for Makati CPS 67 Additional PCOs and 183 PNCOs for Parañaque CPS 50 Additional PCOs and 28 PNCOs for Las Piñas CPS 56 Additional PCOs and 22 PNCOs for Muntinlupa CPS 83 Additional PCOs and 178 PNCOs for Taguig CPS 36 Additional PCOs and 144 PNCOs for Pateros MPS</p>

WHEREAS, the Commission, after review of the PNP's submission, finds the same to be in order considering that such organizational adjustments and increase in manpower shall further enhance the performance and delivery of service of the NCR Police Office.

NOW THEREFORE, the Commission, in the exercise of its administrative control and operational supervision over the Philippine National Police, **HAS RESOLVED, AS IT HEREBY RESOLVES**, to approve the restructuring and strengthening of 15 Police Stations.




All other issuances or any part thereof which are inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.


