RESOLUTION NO. 2020-0393

**PRESCRIBING THE MINIMUM STANDARDS FOR
COMPUTED TOMOGRAPHY (CT) SCAN MACHINE**

WHEREAS, Section 14, Paragraphs (i) and (m) of Republic Act No. 6975, as amended by Section 5, Sub-Paragraphs (5) and (8) of Republic Act No. 8551, empowers the Commission to “approve or modify plans and programs on education and training, logistical requirements, communications, records, information system, crime laboratory, crime prevention and crime reporting as well as prescribe minimum standards for arms, equipment and uniforms and, after consultation with the Philippine Heraldry Commission, for insignia of ranks, awards and medals of honor;”

WHEREAS, NAPOLCOM Memorandum Circular No. 2019-002 dated January 29, 2019, defines the duty and authority of the NAPOLCOM to prescribe minimum standards for uniforms, arms, and equipment to be procured by the Philippine National Police (PNP);

WHEREAS, pursuant to the aforecited legal prescription, the Director, Directorate for Research and Development, through the Technical Working Group for the Formulation and Amendment of Standard (TWG-FAS) Resolution No. 2019-014 dated October 21, 2019, requested for consideration/approval of the Commission on the proposed Minimum Standards for Computed Tomography (CT) Scan Machine;

WHEREAS, the Computed Tomography (CT) Scan Machine is a non-invasive medical equipment that uses specialized X-ray to view inner parts of the body at a given scan time. The image represents a “slice” of the person which can be used for a variety of diagnostic and therapeutic purposes;

WHEREAS, upon thorough review and evaluation, the Commission finds the herein proposed minimum standards for Computed Tomography (CT) Scan Machine to be in order and in conformity with the requirements of Republic Act No. 6975, as amended by Republic Act No. 8551, its Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR), logistics policies and issuances of the Commission;

NOW THEREFORE, the Commission, in the exercise of its statutory powers to administer and control the PNP, **HAS RESOLVED TO PRESCRIBE, AS IT HEREBY PRESCRIBES**, the minimum standards for Computed Tomography (CT) Scan Machine, to read as follows:

Particular	Standards
a. Description	A non-invasive medical equipment that creates cross sectional images of the inner parts of the body.
b. Usage	Diagnosing bone fractures, tumors, cancer monitoring and finding internal bleeding of patient.

c. Capabilities	<p>a) Rotates around the patient's body and tilts at different angles while shooting narrow beams of X-rays in order to construct cross-sectional images (2D and 3D) of the inner parts of the body to be examined.</p> <p>b) Scans in lesser time depending on the area and resolution of the body being imaged.</p> <p>c) Manipulates images via a software that is maintained in a workstation; displays and stores images/data; transmits and transfers said images and data to devices; and produces a hard copy.</p>

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the PNP shall formulate the technical specifications of the Computed Tomography (CT) Scan Machine which will be the basis for its procurement and ensure that said specifications comply with the aforementioned minimum standards and pertinent provisions of Republic Act No. 9184, otherwise known as the "Government Procurement Reform Act".
